D degrees of the period August 2018 - August 2022 will be awarded. The Honourable Governor and Chancellor would grace the occasion. Prof. Sandeep Verma, Secretary, Science & Engineering Research Board (SERB), Department of Science & Technology (DST) would deliver Convocation Address.

Collaborations with Global Wales Group of Universities



The Vice-Chancellor, Prof. T. Ramesh, along with the Representatives of Telangana Government, Sri. Naveen Mittal, Commissioner of Collegiate Education and Prof. Limbadri, Chairman, TSCHE visited Wales Group of Universities during July 2022 and held discussion with the Vice-Chancellor's, Academic Team of Wales Universities Group and the British Council to identify the thrust areas of research and collaborations with each other to promote research and student exchange programmes.

Proposals were put forward to carry out joint research and collaborations in academic programmes with the most reputed Departments in the country Pharmacy, Bio-technology, Micro-biology, Engineering and Computer Sciences. It was also proposed to work jointly in the discipline of Social Sciences including Applied Anthropology to study the socio-economic and cultural changes in the tribal welfare and the society at large.

International Conference on "Higher Education in India –Opportunities, Challenges and Solutions"



The University hosted the International Conference on “Higher Education in India –Opportunities, Challenges and Solutions” organised by the Department of Sociology and PV Narasimha Rao Knowledge Centre during 20-21, March, 2022.

Conference Sub Themes

The Conference deliberated on various sub themes relating to Changing Dimensions of Education, NEP-2020, Management & Governance of HE, P.V.Narasimha Rao on Higher Education: Access, Equity and Accountability, Socio-Economic and Inclusion Realities, Employability Skills HRD, Quality Assurance, Industry - University Collaborations, Research, Training and Consultancy, Regulatory Mechanism-Role of UGC, IQAC and NAAC, Open and Distance Learning and Higher Education in Telangana- Issues & Concerns.

Inaugural Session

Addressing the Inaugural session, the Chief Guest Dr. K. Keshava Rao, Member of Parliament and Chairman, PV Narasimha Rao Centenary Celebrations said that Governments and Regulatory authorities should not remain silent to the changes in higher education in and around the globe. He also highlighted the inadequacies of the NEP 2020 and termed it as WTO driven policy. He said that NEP missed the concept of social justice, equity and access. Prof. T.Ramesh, Vice-Chancellor presided, he opined that India’s higher education system is the world’s third-largest in terms of students, next to China and the United States. Despite



these numbers, now India needs to be placed within the best of the world ranking. However, the expansion in quantity has overshadowed the quality of higher education gradually, he said. Delivering the keynote address, Prof. G. Haragopal of TISS expressed serious concern over declining importance of social sciences and shortage of teaching faculty in several institutions. Distinguished Guest Prof. D. Narasimha Reddy also raised several issues on the public investment in HE and called for debate on new regulations to promote education for all. President IDEA, Prof. K.Murali Manohar, stressed the need to review our experiences and practices. Registrar, Prof. B.Venkatram Reddy, Guest of Honour raised concern on the research dimensions.

Valedictory Session

Sri. Naveen Mittal, Commissioner of Collegiate Education, and Prof. N.Limbadi, Chairman, TSCH, addressed through online mode. Speaking at the Valedictory session, Prof. N. Linga Murthy, former Vice-Chancellor, spoke on the standards in HEI’s, research and innovative skills. There is also an increasing gap between education and employability. Prof. T.Srinivasa Rao, Conference Convener presented the Conference report. He said 87 papers were received and participants were also from USA, Ethiopia, Malaysia, Botswana, Tanzania and Bangladesh. The sessions were conducted through Offline and Online mode. Dr. M. Sadanandam, Co-Conference Secretary supervised the online technical sessions and conducted it smoothly.

Discussions were held on themes such as multidisciplinary and holistic education, skill development and employability, Indian Knowledge Systems, internationalisation of education, digital empowerment, online education, research, innovation and entrepreneurship, ranking and accreditation, equitable and inclusive education, capacity building of teachers for quality education.

He further added that, federal framework should portray the diversities of our society. He cited several instances of contradictions and cautioned its impact on the federal system.

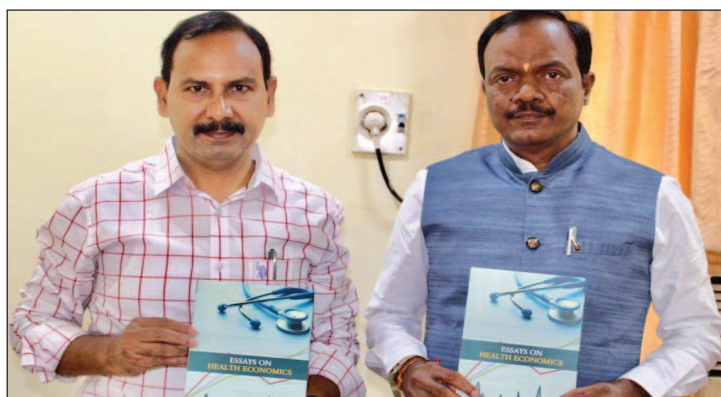

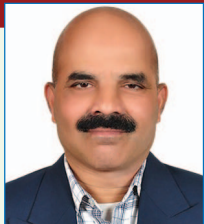

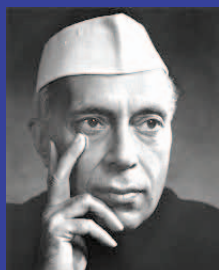
