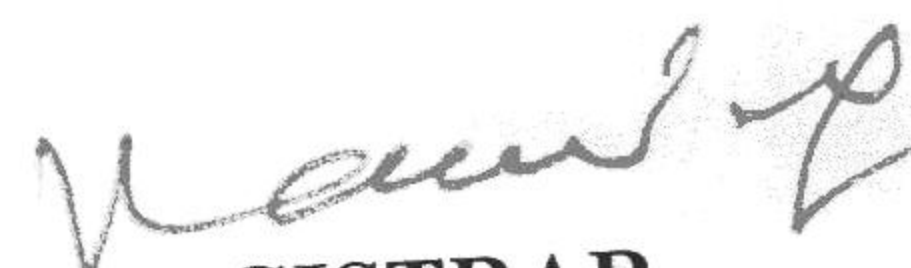
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Sir/Madam,

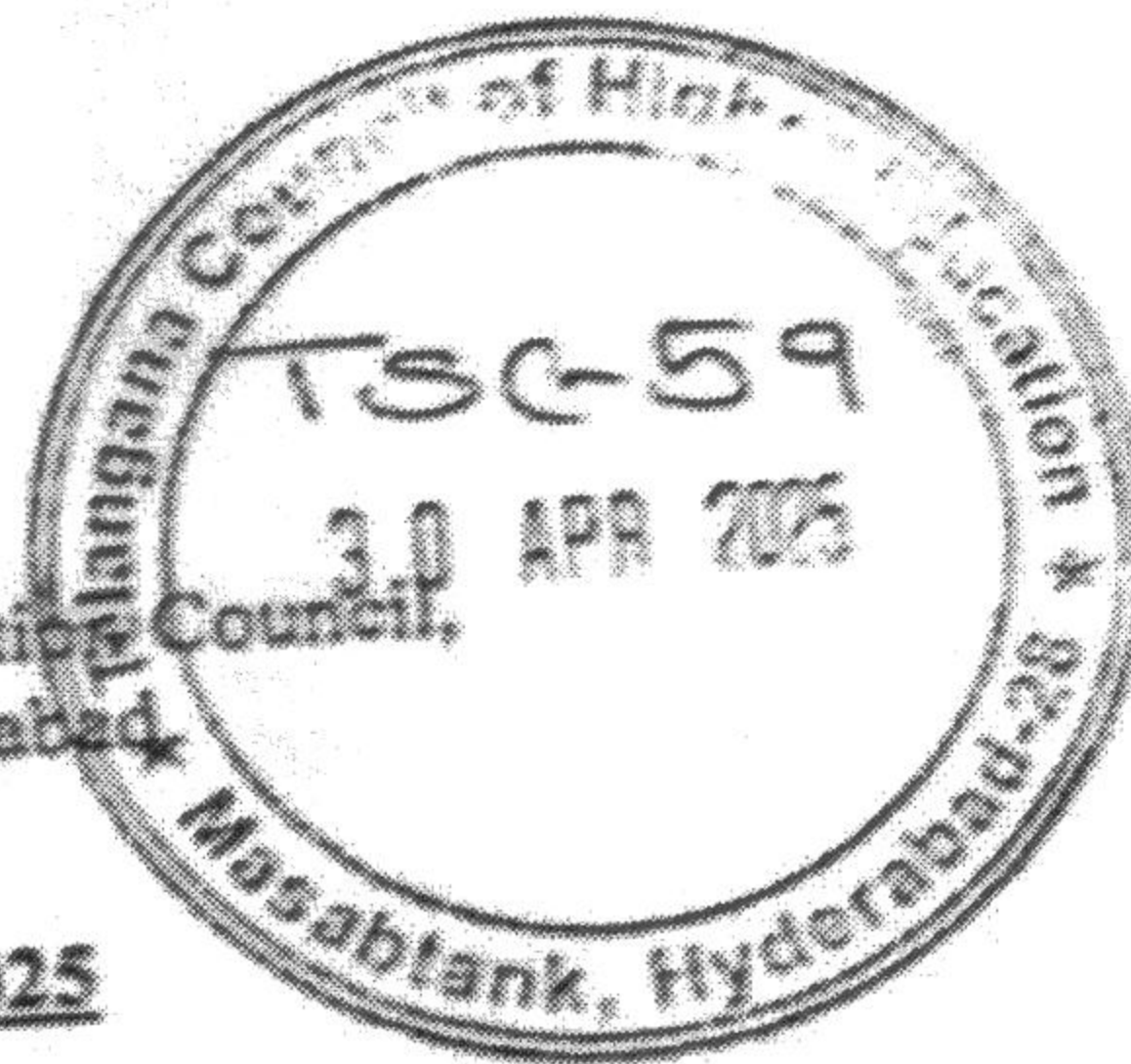

Sir,

Sub: Transport Department- Road Safety- Request to advise all the Universities and Colleges to form Road Safety Clubs - Regarding.

I invite your kind attention to the subject matter and to state that the Road Safety is still a major cause of concern. Last year there were around 1.5 Lakhs deaths due to Road accidents and many more have suffer debilitating injuries. This has caused immense economic and financial hardship and emotional trauma to the affected families. There is an urgent need to make our roads safer because the loss of lives and limbs can not be accepted as an inevitable consequence of mobility.

The Office of the Transport Commissioner with the directives of the Hon'ble Minister for Transport and BC Welfare is making all efforts to make Telangana a safer State for all Road users by associating all the stakeholders. One such effort is encouraging schools to establish Children Awareness Parks in their premises to make the Children as Warriors of Road Safety. Also to make the youth of Telangana, a part of Road Safety, the role of Higher Education Council is vital. Inculcation of significance of Road Safety among the younger minds would not only change the minds of the students towards safe driving but also help us to create safety mindsets in the society through these young ambassadors.

Therefore, I request you to issue instructions to all the Universities and the Colleges to encourage the students to form Road Safety Clubs with an objective to create Road Safety awareness among the students and to work towards safer Roads. Such clubs play a crucial role in educating students about traffic rules, safe driving practices and responsible pedestrian behaviour, ultimately help to create a generation that values life and public safety. Through activities such as awareness campaigns, training workshops, road audits, and collaborations with local authorities, Road Safety Clubs can instil a culture of safety consciousness among students. The details of structure, objectives and activities are enclosed herewith.

ROAD SAFETY CLUBS

Formation:

The College Administration shall appoint a Faculty Advisor (a professor/staff member) to enrol the members initially and to guide the club. In formation, diverse participation shall be encouraged. After initial formation with at least 20-30 members, a formal approval for formation by the College Administration shall be granted. After initial formation, Office bearers such as President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Event Coordinators etc shall be elected/ selected. In the Club, the Members if they want, they can seek partnership or guidance from local Traffic Police, Transport Departments or NGOs

Training and Education:

Organize road safety workshops/ training sessions for members (on basic traffic rules, first-aid, defensive driving, etc.) with the help of local Transport Department Officials or with the Road safety trainers. The College Administration shall facilitate such training programmes, particularly during the vacation days preferably in summer vacation.

Objectives:

Main Objectives of the Road Safety Clubs are:

1. **Promote Road Safety Awareness:** Educate students about traffic rules, safe driving practices and the importance of responsible behaviour on roads.
2. **Encourage Safe Practices:** Foster habits like wearing helmets, using seat belts, avoiding drunk driving, and respecting speed limits.
3. **Develop Leadership in Safety Advocacy:** Build a network of youth who actively promote road safety within and outside the campus.
4. **Assist in Road Safety Campaigns:** Support Governmental and Non-Governmental efforts to reduce accidents and fatalities.
5. **Create a Culture of Responsibility:** Encourage students to act as responsible citizens and role models for others in road usage

Activities:

1. **Awareness Drives:** Organizing seminars, talks, and workshops with Transport/ Police officials, Doctors and Road Safety experts.
2. **Road Safety Campaigns:** Conducting poster-making, slogan-writing, skits, rallies and exhibitions focused on road safety.
3. **Training Workshops:** Teaching basic Road signs, traffic laws, first aid for road accidents, and defensive driving techniques.
4. **Helmet and Seat Belt Checks:** Encouraging voluntary checking drives to promote the use of helmets and seat belts.

5. **Simulation Exercises:** Conducting mock drills to show the impact of rash driving, drunk driving, etc.
6. **Volunteering:** Assisting Traffic Police during heavy traffic days like festivals, events, or peak hours.
7. **Pledge Campaigns:** Getting students to sign road safety pledges to commit to responsible behaviour.
8. **Social Media Outreach:** Using Instagram, YouTube and Facebook to spread road safety messages creatively among the youth.
9. **Competitions:** Organizing quizzes, debates, short film contests, and other competitions around road safety themes.
10. **Data Collection and Surveys:** Conducting small studies or surveys among students to assess the level of awareness and attitude towards road safety.

Assessment:

The Club Members shall assess the **performance** through the following key performance indicators:

1. Number of students trained in **workshops**.
2. Number of campaigns conducted.
3. Social media reach and **engagement**.
4. Feedback from students and **faculty**.
5. Reduction in unsafe practices **observed** around campus.

Finally, Assess the impact (**reduction** in accidents, better awareness among students, etc.). and submit annual reports to **college authorities** and stakeholders.
