The following Act of the Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly received the assent of the Governor on the 21st January, 1991 and the said assent is hereby first published on the 22nd January, 1991 in the Andhra Pradesh Gazette for general information:

ACT No. 4 OF 1991.

An Act to amend and consolidate the laws relating to certain Universities in the state of Andhra Pradesh and for matters connected there with and incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Andhra Pradesh in the Forty-first year of the Republic of India as follows:

15. 1) The Registrar shall be a whole-time paid Officer of the University appointed by the Executive Council for a term of three years or less and on such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by the

- 29) to create posts or professors, readers, lecturers and other teaching posts required by the University;
- 30) to establish, equip and maintain the Univeristy laboratories and libraries;
- 31) to control, in general all colleges in the University area in the manner prescribed by Statutes
- 32) to confer degrees and other academic distinctions on persons who have pursued approved courses of study in a University college or an affiliated college or oriental college, unless exempted therefrom in the manner prescribed by the

Regulations and shall have passed the prescribed examination of the University or shall have carried on research under conditions prescribed;

- 33) to confer honorary degrees or distinctions on approved persons in the manner prescribed;
- 34) to provide for allowances, travelling allowances, scholarships, exhibitions, bursaries, student-ships, medals and prizes;
- 35) to provide for lecturers and instructions to persons not being students of the university and to grant diplomas to them;

36) to establish and maintain hostels;

- 37) to prescribe the fees to be charged for the affiliation and recognition of colleges;
- 38) to prepare the annual reports and annual accounts and the financial estimates of the University for submission to the Academic Senate;
- 39) to enter into any agreement with the Government or with the private management for assuming the management of any institution and taking over its properties and liabilities for any other purpose not repugnant to the provisions of the Act:

Financial estimates

k) all Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations, made under the relevant University Act in respect of the Universities specified in section 4 shall, so far as such Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations, are mnot inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, continue to be in force and be deemed to have been made under the provisions of this Act until they are superseded or modified by Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations made Under this Act.
