Twenty First Convocation



The twenty first Convocation of Kakatiya University was held on the 11th July, 2018 in the University auditorium where 538 students were awarded PhDs and 276, gold medals for topping in their respective disciplines. Graduates of the academic years from 2010 to 2012 received their degree certificates from Prof. R.Sayanna, Vice-Chancellor and Prof. V.Ramgopal Rao, Chief Guest and alumnus of Kakatiya University.

Delivering the Convocation Address, Prof. V.Ramgopal Rao, Director of Indian Institute of Technology, New Delhi felt the need for restructuring of the university system with the movement of the focus from studying to learning.

Prof. Rao said many of the educational institutions attracted the best talent in our country churning out graduates, mostly job seekers rather than job providers. Prof. Rao stressed the need for the universities to expose the students to the real world, cross-discipline collaboration thus developing an ability to build and lead teams. Integration of knowledge and society entails rural and societal-related solutions suitable to our country.

Referring to globalization, Prof. Rao felt the need for welcoming foreign students and scholars to our universities and paving the way for the exchange programmes with foreign universities to become learning centers for international best practices. Online education and the recent MOOCs (Massive Open and Online Courses) funded by the Ministry of Human Resources Development, NPTEL Courses taught by IITs and IISc faculty and the Virtual Lab undertaken by the IIT Delhi have created new levels of opportunities in online education.

Prof. Rao also emphasised that research and teaching should go hand in hand for International Collaborations, Interdisciplinary research and Industry tie-ups. Our country needs the best teachers who can produce students who can excel them, he said. Advising the students not to get drowned in failures, he said that successes and

failures should be considered in right measures. Failures, he opined are the necessary feeders for success. If we can learn from them, students will be able to chart own course for their growth, said Prof. Rao.

Prof. Rao reiterated his philosophy that one must make best use of all opportunities that come in their way, work hard and give 100% to everything he does. Prof. Rao said he worked with this single motto in his life, “whatever you do, do it with a passion and give your best”.



Vice-Chancellor Prof. R. Sayanna, detailing the University's achievements, said the University has been re-accredited with 'A' Grade by the NAAC with increased cumulative grade point for 3.36. The University has been catering to the needs of higher education in Telangana offering 222 programmes in regular mode and 35 courses through distance mode. The varsity has 18 constituent colleges and 529 affiliated colleges, he said.

Geology Seminar on 'Challenges in the development of earth resources'



The Geology Department organized the 2-day Seminar on "Challenges in the Development of Earth Resources -A Geological, Geo-chemical and Geophysical Appraisal" during February 23-24, 2018. The KU Vice-Chancellor Prof. R. Sayanna in his address stressed the need to make efficient use of the fast depleting mineral sources.

Geological Survey of India Training Institute scientist PS Anil Kumar explained the role played by the satellites in identifying the minerals in the earth. The SCCL Deputy General Manager Guru Murthy explained the Company's coal exploration and mining activities. The NGRI scientist Sri V. Balram delivered a lecture on chemical analysis used in geological studies. During the seminar, the NRSC conducted an exhibition displaying remote sensing images of major cities of the World. Students of NIT, KU Engineering Colleges and other Private Engineering Colleges visited the exhibition and appreciated the Department for arranging this exhibition.

The Head, Department of Geology Prof. R. Mallikarjun Reddy gave a presentation on the theme and the objectives of the seminar. Prof. David also took part in the seminar.

Releasing ICET 2018 Results

The online entrance test results for admission into MBA/MCA under TS-ICET 2018 were released on the 13th June, 2018. The Telangana State Council of Higher Education Chairman Prof. T.Papi Reddy released the TSICET-2018 results. Chairman and University Vice-Chancellor Prof. R. Sayanna and Convener TSICET-2018 Prof. M.Subramanaya Sharma and Prof. Limbadri, Vice-Chairman TSCHE, Prof. Ramchandram, Vice-Chancellor of Osmania University and other officials were present on this occasion. The Test, being conducted for five consecutive years, was held in two sessions on May 23 and another session on May 24th, 2018. A total of 61,439 candidates registered for the test, 60 centers in Telangana and 4 selected places in Andhra Pradesh were arranged. About 55,241 appeared for the test, while 49,812 candidates were qualified in the test.

33rd ACADEMIC SENATE

Date: 28-03-2018



The 33rd meeting of the Kakatiya University Academic Senate was held on the 28th March, 2018 in which the budget of Rs. 293.41 crore for 2018-19 was approved.

Under the Chairmanship of Prof. R.Sayanna, Vice-Chancellor, the budget was unanimously approved by the members. Presented by Commerce and Business Management Prof. Ch. Rajesham, it is estimated that the varsity would get revenue of Rs. 267.21 crore and expenditure would be Rs. 293.41 crore. The opening balance stands at Rs.43.09 crore.

The University needs Rs.148.30 crore towards payment of salaries of teaching and non-

teaching staff, and an amount of Rs.87.11 crore would be sanctioned by the Government as grant-in-aid. This year, the Government has earmarked Rs.25 crore as development budget.

The areas of expenditure include Rs.1.76 crore for NSS activities, Rs.15 lakh for Internet facilities, Rs.43.59 crore for examination branch, Rs.13.70 lakh for library, Rs.8.80 lakh for University Health Centre, Rs.7.50 lakh for welfare and recreations activities, Rs.18 lakh for student services, Rs.3 lakh for library automation, Rs.10 lakh for plantation, beautification of campus, maintenance of lawns and Rs.20 lakh for laying of roads.

Prof. K. Purushotham, Registrar spoke on the developmental activities and proposed initiatives on the occasion. Former Vice-Chancellors Prof. V.Gopal Reddy, Prof. N.Linga Murthy expressed concern over the dearth of teaching faculty. Sri M. Gourishankar, Incharge Finance Officer, Principals, Deans, Heads of Departments, and Administrative Officers were among those present in the Senate.
