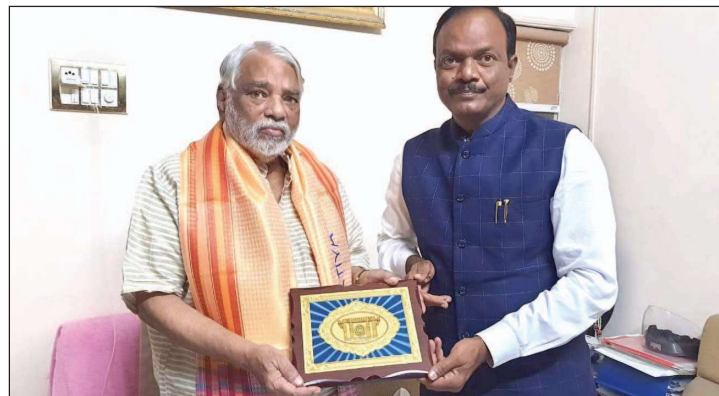
Bhatkamma Festival

The University launches 10 day Haritha Haram Programme

The Programme Haritha Haram was launched by Telangana Chief Minister K.Chandrasekhar Rao on 3 July 2015. It is one of the Telangana Flagship programmes to rejuvenate degraded forests, by mass forestation with an intention to improve the forest coverage to 33% from the 24%. The State Government fixed the target of 230 crore plantations within five years' time.

The 10-day programme from July 2nd to 11th, 2021 was formally launched in the University campus by Prof. T.Ramesh, Vice-Chancellor. The University assigned responsibilities to different departments and Constituent Colleges and ensured the implementation of the programme in a well designed way. The University planted 1200 saplings in 2 acres covering all the departments. Haritha Haram drive is expected to result in lowering of climatic temperatures, reduction in pollution levels, increase in general public health, increase in wild resources, and enhancement of wildlife and biodiversity.

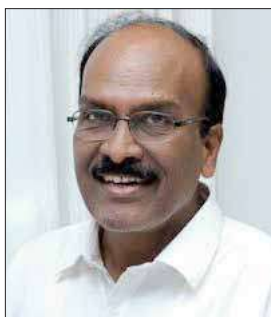

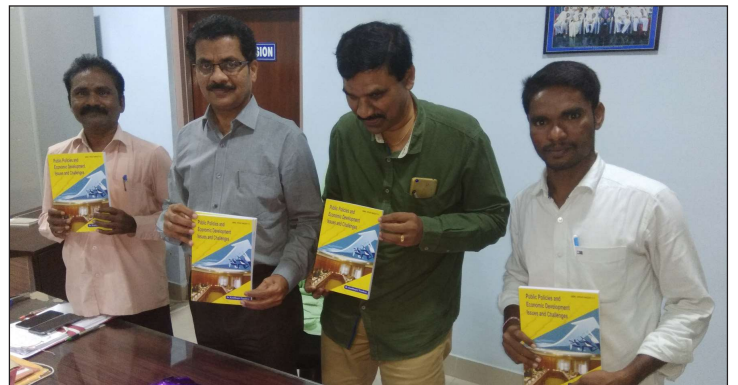
