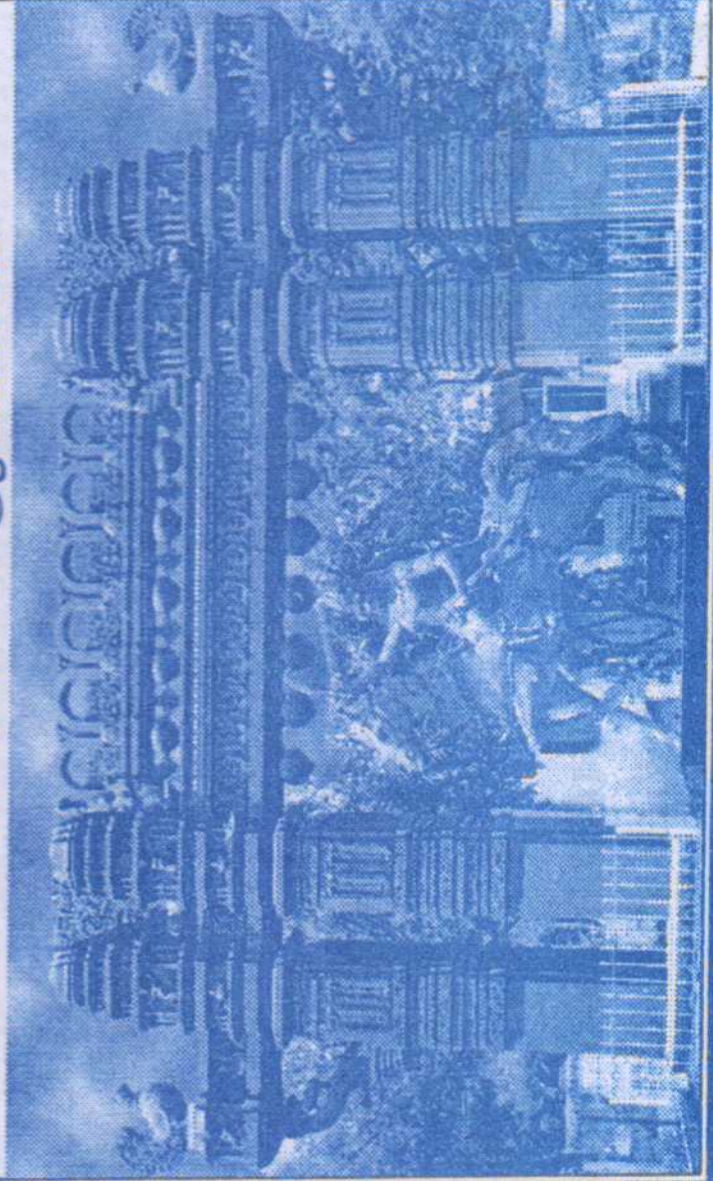

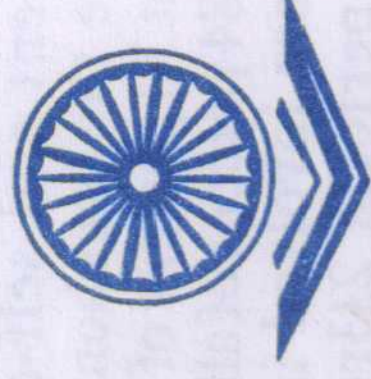

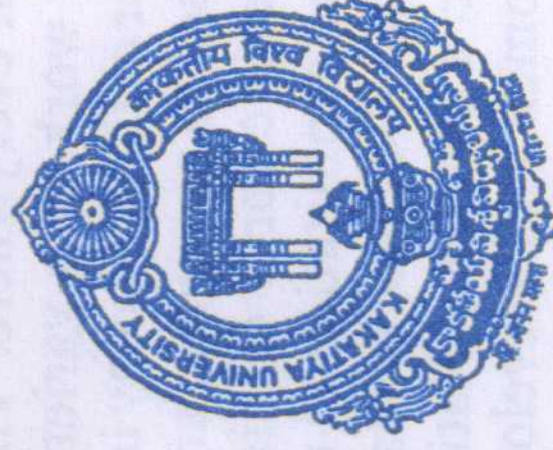

Theme of the Seminar:

Women constitute half of the population. Despite constitutional guarantees and socio-economic progress women are being discriminated and suppressed everywhere and virtually in every aspect of life. Today in rapidly changing socio-economic environment, women are exposed to traditional and non-traditional tasks to share the burden of the male members in the family both in rural and urban areas. A large number of women who are engaged in different works in rural India are self-sufficient and self-confident. In general they are the backbone of the rural economy. About 70 percent of the total work population and 84 percent of all economically active women are involved in agriculture. Though they perform 2/3rd of work in agriculture and contribute their might for agriculture and allied activities, such as sericulture, horticulture & a variety of cottage industries. They are not recognized and face discrimination everywhere. Though women are toiling at work in a variety of fields in informal sector of the economy in countryside, they are exposed to economic and other types of gender specific form of discrimination, oppression and exploitation at their places of work place. Also they face sexual harassment. In this center, a Two-Day National Seminar on "Rural Women and Development: Some Issues and Perspectives" is going to be organized on 16th & 17th March, 2019 to discuss the problems of women workers at thread bare and to get to the core of the problem.
