#### **About Kakatiya University**

#### **About Seminar**

The Indian Political System has evolved through the dynamics of electoral politics and the formation of governments, with a history marked by the dominance of a single political party at the national level. However, this trend began to shift at the provincial level in 1967. Since its inception, the system has witnessed the emergence of new social and political formations, particularly during elections. This trend was evident in the first general elections, where political alliances were formed in the Madras Presidency, and similar alliances were seen at the national level with parties like the Hindu Mahasabha, Akali Dal, the Kisan Mazdoor Praja Party, and the Socialist Party, among others. The rise of regional parties after 1967 marked the growing influence of regional aspirations from different socio-cultural sections across various regions. At the national level, political alliances began to take shape after the split in the Congress Party in 1969, culminating in a fully formed political alliance

in the 1977 elections. Since the formation of the Janata Party Government in 1977 India has experienced eleven coalition governments, with the twelfth currently functioning under the National Democratic Alliance (NDA). In contemporary times, political alliances can be understood on two levels: provincial and national. At the national level, when regional parties hold a larger share within an alliance, they often pursue their own political interests. On the other hand, when national parties have a stronger presence and leadership, they tend to play a more significant role in shaping the political landscape. Furthermore, post-election political formations often raise concerns regarding their ethical and democratic nature, as they may not accurately reflect the popular verdict. While political alliances can reflect regional aspirations and promote a federal spirit on one hand, they also serve as pillars of democratic or national governments on the other. Unfortunately, recent political alliances have increasingly been driven by the pursuit of power, rather than fostering a spirit of federalism or democratic integrity. In this context, it is crucial to discuss the nature of political formations and their impact on national development, alongside the influence of power politics.
