About the Seminar

Telangana is the 29th State of India, formed on the 2nd of June 2014. The Telangana region was part of the Hyderabad State from Sept. 17th 1948 to Nov 1st 1956, until it was merged with Andhra State to form the Andhra Pradesh State. After decades of movement for a separate State, Telangana was created by passing the AP State Reorganization Bill in both houses of Parliament. The State has an area of 1,14,840 Sq Km and has a population of 3,52,86,757. The major concerns of newly formed Government are providing water (Neeru), employment (Nivamakalu) and Budget (Nidulu) to people and ensuring sustainable development in the State. Keeping this in view, the Government has launched several programmes such as Mission Kakatiya, Mission Bhagiratha, Harithaharam, Housing for the poor, old-age pensions, Kalayanalaxmi/Shadhi Mubharak and several other programmes for the development of people. Among these, most important programme is "Mission Kakatiya" which would bring sustainable rural development in the hinterland.

Mission Kakatiya: Unlike in other States, tanks have been the lifeline of Telangana owing to the State's geographical positioning. The topography and rainfall pattern in Telangana have made tank irrigation an ideal type of irrigation by storing and regulating water flow for agricultural use. In fact, construction of tanks in Telangana has been an ageold activity since pre-Satavahana era. During the Kakatiya era, the construction of tanks was carried out with utmost technical expertise. Tanks such as Ramappa, Pakhala, Laknavaram, Ghanapuram, and Bayyaram, which were built by Kakatiyas, resemble seas and they greatly helped agriculture and overall development and prosperity of the Kakatiya kingdom. Subsequent rulers such as Qutubshahis and Asafjahis have carried out the vision and legacy of Kakatiyas, which envisages revival and restoration of Minor Irrigation Sources in

Telangana State. Inspired by the vision and legacy of Kakatiyas, the Government of Telangana under the guidance of Sri K. Chandra Shekar Rao, Hon'ble Chief Minister, has launched "Mission Kakatiya" (Mana Ooru-Mana Cheruvu) creating a new hope for sustainable rural development.

The Mission Kakatiya is in operation for more than two years and it is the time to evaluate the programme and highlight its strengths and weaknesses and suggest measures for improvement. More specially in terms of its access, equity, quantity, and quality of water to the people for sustainable agricultural development. The discussion on this subject is more relevant in the context of global warming and seasonal imbalances, food insecurity, agrarian crises and farmers suicides, etc.
