### About Kakatiya University

Kakatiya University was established in 1976 to fulfill the aspirations of the Telangana people for higher education. It is located in the historical city, Warangal, the erstwhile seat of the Kakatiya rulers. It has crossed 41 years now it has strength of 2.25 lakhs students under its campus, constituent and affiliated colleges.

The development of the University over the years has been gradual but impressive. The University was initially accredited with 'B+' grade by the NAAC in 2003 and reaccredited with 'A' grade in 2009 and 2017. The University, situated in a sprawling area of about 640 acres, has seven colleges on the campus, with a network of 18 constituent, 529 affiliated colleges. The University is now offering 120 programmes in Engineering, Pharmacy, Law, Computer Science, Business Management, Education, Science, Arts, Commerce, Oriental courses within the University, constituent and affiliated colleges.

As many as 15 Departments in 8 faculties have SAP and DRS programmes. It has more 30 thanMajor Research Projects in Progress. 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### How to reach Warangal

The city of Warangal is well connected by rail and road. The University campus stands at a distance of about 10 kms from both railway stations of Kazipet and Warangal. The delegates can get down at any of these railway stations.

Warangal City is 140 Kms from Hyderabad, the state capital of Telangana. The nearest airport is Rajiv Gandhi International Airport at Shamshabad in Hyderabad. It is about 170 kms towards Warangal by road. Luxury buses will be available from Uppal Centre to Warangal which is 30 Kms away from the Airport.

The conference organizers will guide the delegates for any information they seek regarding their travel.

### IMPORTANT TOURIST PLACES IN WARANGAL



The famous "Thousand Pillars Temple" build in 1163 A.D. by Rudra Deva is situated between Hanamkonda and Warangal town. As excellent example of Kakatiya architecture, built in the style of Chalukya temples- a star shaped and triple - shrine, with preformatted screens, exquisite icons and rock cut elephants. The temple is dedicated to Lord Shiva.

Located in Warangal, Telangana it is known to be one of the oldest temples for Goddess Bhadrakali in India. This temple is located on the bank of the Bhadrakali Lake, a picturesque location between Hanamkonda and Warangal. The temple's main Deity Goddess Bhadrakali's image here unlike other images of the mother goddess is with pleasant looking eyes holding weapons in her eight hands. A statute of a lion, on which the Goddess is said to ride, sits grandly opposite the sanctum sanctorum. As per the writings on the temple wall this temple is believed to be constructed by the King Pulakesi II of Chalukya dynasty around 625 A.D. The lake was built later by Ganapathi Deva, a King in Kakatiya Dynasty. A road leading to the temple was also added during that period. The deity and temple are renowned to be power and the Goddess fulfils the wishes of her devotees who come to seek blessings from far and wide





The Warangal Fort existed in its full glory during the 13th century A.D. Historians and archaeologist generally accept that an earlier brick-walled structure was replaced with stone by Ganapathi Deva before 1262 A.D and that his successors- Rudramadevi and Prataparudra - added to its height and added gateways, square bastions and additional circular earthen walls prior to 1323.

The construction of the fort was completed towards the end of the Kakatiya period. There were later modifications between the 15<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> centuries, comprising principally the addition of barbicans to the found gates in the stone wall and the creation of gates in the outer earthen wall. Remnants of the structure can be seen today near to the town of Warangal, the Kakatiya Capital. The Archaeological Survey of India has listed the remains as a Monument of National importance.

The Ramalingeswara Temple is popularly known as the Ramappa Temple an engineering marvel of the 13th Century A.D. It is built on Ramappa Lake an ingeniously designed tank where a 2000 ft long earthen dam connects a semi circular chain of hills to form a lake. To-day the lake offers boating facilities. The temple and with its spectacular lake has been described as a glowing star in the galaxy of medieval temples in the Deccan. The UNESCO has recognized Ramappa Temple as World Heritage Monument





In and around the bustling town of Warangal are various lakes and temples that offer respite. Laknavaram Lake is situated about 80 Kms from Warangal. Spread over an area of 10000 acres and as one approach it is the imaginary of a seeming endless lake fills the horizon. The huge natural lake was discovered by Kakatiya rulers who constructed a sluice gate to monitor the water flow. The lake has about 13 small islands scattered amidst the forests. There is a suspension bridge that connects the island of the lake and is great attraction to the tourists. One can have a relaxing picnic event at the lake, away from the hustle and bustle of the city and Laknavaram Lake enjoy moments alone with nature.

The sanctuary around the beautiful Pakhal Lake lays 60 Kms from Warangal. A guest house run by the Forest Department is located on the shores of the lake surrounded by hills. Moonlit nights are a heavenly experience. The lake itself was excavated in the 13th century. The sanctuary is home to the tigers, leopards and panthers and sambhars apart from a large number of migratory birds that arrive in winter. The Forest Department has put up "machaans" in the sanctuary which afford a good view of the scenery around. The nearest rail head is Warangal, 144 Kms from Hyderabad and the best time the area is between November and June
